Branch of Service: Army - Infantry.

Duty Assignments: U. S.: In training - Instructor in Combat Training - Attended Officers Training School, Fort Benning, Georgia. Overseas: February 1945, First assignment was handling replacements in Philippines, then assigned to 164th Infantry, Company F, Americal Division, driving out Japanese who were entrenched in the hills of the Philippine Islands.

Awarded: Purple Heart and Silver Star, posthumously.

Rank: Second Lieutenant.

Served: 35 months.

Killed: April 29, 1945 on Negros Island while leading his platoon assaulting a hill. Reinterred in Fairfax Cemetery, Fairfax, Virginia.

Mother: Mrs. Egbert T. Watt.
