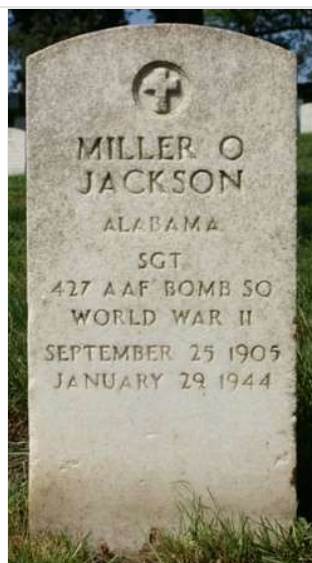

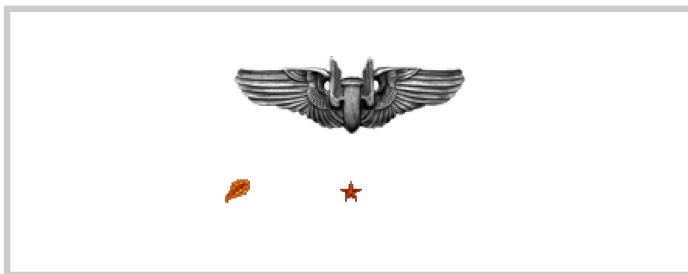

Last Known Activity
Miller Owen Jackson was born on September 28, 1905 in Alabama, to George H. and Mary A. Jackson. The US Census 1910 shows the family in Oklahoma.

Miller enlisted in Charlottesville, Virginia on October 23, 1942. His enlistment papers state he had completed grammar school, and was employed as a carpenter. (The US Census 1940 states he had completed 4 years of high school.) He married Mathilda W. Lease at some time, but his enlistment form states he was separated, without dependents.

He was trained as an aerial gunner, then assigned to the 303rd Bomb Group at Molesworth, England. There, he was assigned to the combat crew led by Lt Fowler on November 16, 1943.

He flew his first combat mission on December 11, 1943. This was followed by

6 more, all with the Fowler crew. On January 29, 1944, the crew was tasked to fly as part of a raid on the City Center of Frankfurt, Germany.

The aircraft crossed the enemy coast with #1 engine malfunctioning, throwing oil. Then, Fowler was forced to feather #4. Losing speed and altitude, he jettisoned the bomb load and swung toward England. Enemy aircraft attacked, and severely damaged the plane. The oxygen system, intercomm, and most flight instruments were shot away.

Fowler was forced to crash-land near Soire-Saint Gery, Belgium. Sgt Jackson died of wounds shortly afterward. Some of the crew evaded, but were captured later. The remainder were captured at the crash scene.

Sgt Jackson was recovered and sent to the U.S. after the war. A U.S. National Cemetery Internal Control Card states "Returned with WWII dead from Belgium." It records his burial at Arlington National Cemetery in Section 34, Site 1911 on June 24, 1949.

evaded for some time before being captured. Jackson died of wounds at the crash scene. Lt Rawlings, Sgt Arrington, Sgt Zimmer, and Sgt Ferguson successfully evaded and returned to Allied control. The remaining crew members were captured immediately at the crash site.

In the crew photo, Sgt Jackson is in the front row, 2nd from right.
