Mary's hints for researching on site:

1. Plan your research trip! See website above.
2. Read everything on line about researching before your visit.
3. Note Record Group numbers, etc, ahead of time. This information is required for pull slips. Make a photocopy of your pull slip for your future reference and citation. If you do not finish with your research, ask for documents to be held. (Three to five business days.)
4. No records are retrieved on Saturdays. For first visit, go early on a weekday to get researcher identification card. The Research Center is open from 9 AM –5 PM, Monday through Saturday.
5. As of October 2017 pull times are: 9:30 AM, 10:30 AM, 11:30 AM., 1:00 PM, 2:00 PM, and 3:00 PM, Monday through Friday. A late arrival may not allow viewing of documents.

6. Know what sort of equipment is allowed in researcher's room. I.e. No flash camera; no wand scanner. Learn more here: www.archives.gov/publications/general-info-leaflets/71-06-dc-area-records.html
 7. Take something to work on while your request is being filled.
 8. Add money to your researcher identification card to use the Archives photocopier.
 9. Carry the minimum with you. Your belongings are required to be stored in lockers.
 10. The researcher's room provides paper and pencils.
 11. Keep good notes on records and record groups consulted, so you can retrace your steps.
 12. Use the finding aids located in the research center to help you in your research.
 13. Sit at a non-reserved table.
